Summer – The Amazing Suffolk Punch



The beautiful and rare Suffolk Punch mare Summer **was bitten by an Adder** whilst in her paddock. The bite caused extreme pain and calcification of the bite and immediate surrounding area. Incredibly, the calcification usually manifests itself on the surface affecting cells outwardly but on this occasion the calcification grew inwardly causing pain and soreness. The examining vet pronounced Summer 90% lame in the leg that was bitten. Apart from using oils to help soften the calcification the only other

treatment used was a Magnafield set at 0.5Hz. Summer's owner, Heather recently wrote the following:

"Good news, my old gelding, is now sound enough to plough as he has stood next to Summer and the unit for quite some time. Summer is all fine and back into full time employment. The unit is the only thing that has repaired her. Truly amazing. THANK YOU!"

This trial involved a 20 year old mare that was **suffering from a severe arthritic condition to both her front knees**. The knees were swollen with fluid retention. The mare was having difficulties walking and because of this difficulty and the pain involved chose to lie down both in her stable and in her paddock when she was led out to it.

A PEMF unit set to 0.5Hz was installed into her stable. The unit was switched to repeat cycle which treated the horse for 20 minutes then switched off automatically for 20 minutes then reactivated and continued the 20 minute on and 20 minute off duty cycle.

After 1 week the report came back that the swelling had reduced considerably and that the horse was much more comfortable and happy to walk in her paddock. After 3 weeks the swelling in her knees had gone completely and in the words of her carer "She is running around her paddock like a two year old"

Khalifa



On the 27th March 2013, the Arabian stallion known as Khalifa returned to the Seer Al Salam stables in Dubai to continue his endurance training. Khalifa is the horse that was reported on in the Alliance for Natural Health online newsletter. At the time he was suffering from the condition known as **equine sarcoids (skin tumours)**. This condition has debilitating effects on horses and it is notoriously difficult to treat. Treatment usually involves topical application of chemotherapy

ointments, lancing and the use of ligatures. While temporary relief is almost always obtained the inevitability is that the sarcoids (skin tumours) return and the owner or stables have to repeat the cycle which is damaging to the animals health.

When Khalifa first started the PEMF therapy it was agreed that no dietary changes were to be made or medicines used during the proposed 12 month trial period and that only the Magnafield PEMF unit was to be used and although anecdotal the success of the treatment stands as testament to alternative healing modality
